RING SIZE GUIDE

Measure your ring size

BEFORE YOU PRINT

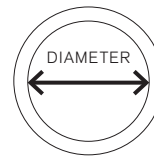
Please note that you must print this .pdf in order to measure correctly.

Ensure that Page Scaling is set to "None" on your print dialogue box.
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After you have printed

Measure the bar to the right. It must be exactly 50 mm or 2 inches long.

Please see the circles below for circumference and diameter in mm.



Carefully follow the instructions to determine your ring size.

- Avoid measuring your ring finger when it is cold.
- Always measure your ring size in the evening when your fingers tend to be swollen
- Observe that a wide ring usually requires a larger size.
- Be very careful when measuring your finger since one millimetre corresponds to an entire ring size.
- Keep in mind that rings must fit over knuckles.

There are two ways to measure your ring size

- 1) • Select a ring that fits the finger you intend to wear your ring on.
 - Compare the ring's inner diameter with the circles below
 - When you are able to see the black line just next to your rings inner circle you have found the right size.
 - If your ring size falls between two circles, choose the larger circle.
- 2) • Select a ring that fits the finger you intend to wear your ring on.
 - Measure the inner diameter of your ring in millimetres (mm) using a ruler.
 - The measured total number of millimetres is your size.
